

On wrong views the Buddha said,

"For a person of the wrong view, whatever bodily, verbal, or mental conduct he undertakes in accordance with that view, and whatever intention, aspiration, wish, and intentional formations he calls forth or makes in accordance with that view, all lead to what is undesirable, unwanted, and disagreeable, to harm and suffering. For what reason? Because the view is bad. Just as, when a seed of bitter melon or hot chilli is planted in moist soil, it transforms any nutriment it obtains from the soil and the water into a fruit with a bitter, harsh, and disagreeable taste, even so is it for a person of wrong view".

It is especially for this reason, that we must realise the importance of having a school that upholds and encourages the development of wisdom, upright moral conduct, and diligence, in our children. For what purpose? To teach them, to plant in them whilst at a young age, the seeds of right view which leads to the non-harm and the ending of suffering for themselves and the lives that they will touch. This is why a school is a preventative hospital, a guard against future infection, a noble place of refuge for the community.

So I invite you to come, join us as a partner, to help grow this noble Buddhist School.

# Enlightenment through Wisdom, Morality and Diligence.

Pal Buddhist School's motto, "Enlightenment Through Wisdom, Morality and Diligence", underpins the educational philosophy of the School's ethos and culture.

Inspired by the Buddha's Eightfold Noble Path, our School believes in not only imparting academic knowledge, but also cultivating the whole individual through right wisdom (paññā), morality (sīla) and diligence. It is on these three pillars that the School derives its academic, cultural, spiritual and disciplinary principles & programs.



**Wisdom:** A PBS training ground to develop right understanding and wholesome speech is our compulsory public speaking competition, Right Speech.



**Generosity:** A PBS training ground to cultivate generosity is our volunteeering events such as the Benefactors Gathering, allowing our students to serve others out of gratitude, respect and kindness.



**Diligence:** A PBS training ground that fosters due diligence is our Right Action: Master the Stage - a compulsory creative and performing arts competition which selfless-joy, persistence and the will of mastery arise in our students.



**Morality:** A PBS training ground to put dhamma into practice is our after-school SRC's Dust and Shine club, wherein the students will clean the school once a week.

## Welcome to Our School

Pal Buddhist School is a non-profit organisation and provides an exceptional education that is accredited by the Australian NSW Department of Education for certification from Primary School up to and including the Higher School Certificate (HSC).

We are a leader in educational teaching technology and innovation; being one of a very rare number of schools that has developed and implemented a "paperless classroom" system. We term this new way of learning, the 4D Learning Experience: where learning is informative and transformative; where good practice and efficiency are integrated into a student's life and habits; where our students can learn anytime, any place and with a peer, group or teacher support.

Being the first and only Buddhist High School in Australia, we incorporate the Buddhist philosophy into everyday teaching, as a matter of passing on moral and virtuous behaviour, good character and wisdom. At Pal Buddhist School, students learn these values by action. Our students engage actively in charity and leadership, both internally in the school as well as externally such as the local community, and nationally around the state and country.





**Mentorship Program:** Our students consolidate their knowledge through our Mentorship program. For e.g. our Stage 6 Wake up Program wherein they mentor primary students to build qualities and ethics of a leader before they enter the real world.



**Taekwondo Classes:** Our Primary school students develop persistence and mindfulness through physical education programs.

Through the mindful selection of appropriate opportunities, our students learn the following FOUR virtues (which derive from the Buddha's teaching): compassion, loving kindness, selfless joy and equanimity.

Thus, we are not a religious school in the sense that we hold to any ideas on the basis of pure faith and mere dogma, or in the sense that we use faith as a trump-card to reason. Rather we are a School of science in its truest sense: we aim to foster in our students a love of the pursuit of truth in all domains, the material and the spiritual, the discovered as well as the undiscovered.



# **Our 4D Learning Method**

Traditionally, classrooms were thought of to be a place for the old 'chalk and talk' paradigm. A classroom would therefore be considered great if students were engaged and interested in the content being presented to them. So, for our School, the challenge was to ask: "What can we do better for the students?"

One thing is certain: technology is changing how schools teach and how students learn. It will continue to change how we access & interact with the content that shapes our educational experiences at a rapidly accelerating rate.

At Pal Buddhist School, our 4D classrooms are student-centered, differentiated, and filled with the creative buzz that comes with engagement in collaboration and exploration. This approach, designed for all disciplines, facilitates student ownership of learning while teaching technological, analytical and adaptive skills necessary for the ever-changing digital world.



**4D Learning:** Our technology philosphy is educating our students on how to use technology as a tool, not as a weapon.

The goal is not to just go paperless. The goal is to provide the highest-quality education we can.

- COLLABORATE with fellow students or the teacher, whether in or out of class, to complete group work or project based learning.
- HAVE PEACE OF MIND, as all information and workbooks are stored and backed up onto a secure cloud server.
- > ACCESS all their learning content from any point in time, even from previous years and subjects.

- SAVE TIME by accessing and marking their student workbooks any time and anywhere. Homework feedback is then instantenously synchonised with the student notebooks, and can be accessed immediately.
- > ORGANISE all their subject and module content into a digital library, where it will be even easier for students to learn and follow course sequence.
- CUSTOMISE STUDENT LEARNING, by being able to better determine and monitor individual student needs, and thus able to design and push specific activities to improve student performance.





At Pal Buddhist School, we understand that the strength of a student's ability and development lies in a triangular partnership formed between the student, the parents, and the School. Scientific research has shown that students with parents who are involved in their education, are much more motivated, focused and aim for higher goals.

Parents are therefore encouraged to be involved with their child's education, and this is even easier to do so with our Parent Portal, where information about a student's marks, grades, homework submission rates, achievements, school activities, and more, can be conveniently accessed via a smartphone or computer.

Furthermore, direct communication between teachers and parents is able to occur more seamlessly via the portal, allowing faster transparency between home and school, as well as a coherence of values taught. #### **COMPULSORY TRAINING GROUNDS FOR YEAR 3-12**

#### Right Livelihood

Students engage in a cooking competition where parents will be required to coach their children on the skills and understanding of how to cook; whilst instilling in the student, an appreciation of family culture, traditions, and responsibilities.



A creative and performing arts competition where all students are required to choose either a music, drama or dance category to prepare their piece with mentors and then perform their piece in several rounds of the competition. Selected acts are exhibited at the annual CAPA Show.

#### Right Speech

A public-speaking competition that develops in students, public-speaking skills, confidence building, team building and mentoring. In addition, students will cultivate their wisdom, morality and diligence for long term benefits.

#### **Right Thinking**

A whole-school debating competition that students cultivate leadership, investigation, critical analysis, listening and deep thinking skills. Students are introduced to a range of global issues and expand their mind as they match wits against their competition. They deliver speeches based on logic and research, attempting to persuade a panel of judges to endorse their argument.

One of Fairfield's newest schools has taken the number one spot in a list of the top performing high schools in NAPLAN.

Years 5 and 7 students at Pal Buddhist School — established in 2013 as Australia's only Buddhist school — outperformed others in the region with an average score of 591.6 across literacy and numeracy subjects.

Freeman Catholic College ranked second with a score of 584.7, followed by Canley Vale High with 568.5, Prairiewood High with 566.2 and Bonnyrigg High with 562.2.

"If you can actually get a student to activate their humanistic side ... then you can bring anybody to become a studious learner. In fact, they will be able to learn and absorb knowledge, any kind of knowledge," he said.

He said parents were looking for "a more serious" and "lifelong" education for their children and by nurturing students' moral values their academic results also improved.

"By focusing on being a good human being, they develop compassion, they develop selfless joy ... they also develop an unshakeable mind."

The latest NAPLAN results was a "vote of confidence" in the school, which had the potential to one day be "on par or even better" than James Ruse Agricultural High School - which topped the state - or Sydney Grammar, he said.



Freeman Catholic College at Bonnyrigg Heights made the top five.

The NAPLAN test is designed to measure students in literacy and numeracy and track progress.

The NAPLAN test remains controversial with the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority, the federal body responsible for developing national curriculum and assessment, this year revamping the MySchool website where school's NAPLAN results are publicly displayed.

Focus groups across the country found MySchool was difficult to navigate and was filled with technical language and jargon.

ACARA also had to further explain on the website the benefits of NAPLAN and MySchool to parents.

#### A School of Love & Generosity

Our school has incorporated into its curriculum voluntary service to the needy in places like nursing homes, homeless shelters and schools for those with special needs. The purpose is to give our students the opportunity for exposure to real human suffering and to develop skilful responses based on the four kinds of love taught by the Buddha: goodwill, compassion, appreciation and patient understanding.

#### A School of Mindfulness

This special dimension to Buddhist education provides our students with highly effective remedies to everyday stresses and enhances performance. Although mindfulness has been dubbed a panacea to a range of modern ailments, actually, it is but one component taken out of the holistic path of life-training taught by the Buddha.

To maximise the potentials of mindfulness training, we bring it into a holistic context, firstly, by the study and understanding of mindfulness theory through the Dhamma, and secondly, by its realistic application and practice in everyday life and experiences.

# **Our Expansion**

#### **Our New Leppington Campus**

Pal Buddhist School is at an exciting stage of our journey. In 2017, four years after our inauguration, our community embarked on a mission to raise funds to purchase a 3-acre block of land in Leppington, New SouthWales, to build a state-of-the-arts campus for our students.

On November 5 2020, we officially settled on the purchase of our new land. We will continue to serve the community of Canley Vale and its surroundings while building our new campus in Leppington. The Leppington campus will be built over several stages and is expected to have a student population of 900 when its capacity has been reached.

The School will be designed to be ecologically sustainable making use of solar & water retention technology We will be co-educational school for primary and secondary students.

















In the past few years, our students have contributed to the Red Cross foundation, World Vision and the Tzu Chi Foundation in events involving typhoons, earthquakes, bushfires and floods.

#### > Asylum Seeker Centre
